When starting primary education, children are asked to put on their own coats, change into their gym clothes and back and go to the toilet independently. We recommend students wear clothes without buttons

and zippers and shoes with Velcro rather than laces until they accomplished this independently.

#### **HAPPY LEARNERS** WHO FEEL SAFE

We believe all children should feel safe and secure to enable them to develop and learn together. We recognize that our standards of behaviour have a profound and lasting influence on the development and life chances of children and young people. Children can be safe and happy to learn together in a positive, optimistic, and cooperative environment The personal goals of IPC - such as respect, thoughtfulness, cooperative , and morality - play a major part in our teaching.
