

PLACEMENT OF STUDENTS

At Optimist International School (OIS), students are typically placed in a class that aligns with their chronological age. Our placement guidelines follow an academic year running from *October 1st to September 30th*.

Programme Overview

OIS offers an international primary curriculum, with an additional Dutch Enrichment Programme (DEP)* available from Group 6 onwards.

Dutch Enrichment Programme (DEP)*

The DEP is designed for students who wish to enhance their academic Dutch proficiency, supporting their integration into Dutch society and facilitating a smoother transition to secondary education in the Netherlands. More details about the DEP can be found on our website.

Class Structure & Age Groups

International Programme

Our primary school follows the International Primary Curriculum (IPC) and caters to children aged 4 to approximately 11 years old in:

Group 1 to Group 7

Dutch Enrichment Programme (DEP)

The DEP also follows the International Primary Curriculum (IPC) and is available from Group 6 to Group 8, catering to children aged 9 to approximately 12 years old.

International Primary Curriculum (IPC) & Mileposts

The IPC curriculum is organised into Mileposts (MP), with each spanning one, two, or three academic years. Within these Mileposts, we may have single-year groups or combination groups, depending on the cohort size and educational needs.






Milepost Structure

Student Placement & Progression

Students are placed in a **class/milepost** alongside peers of the same or similar ages. This approach is designed to support their **academic, social, behavioural, and emotional development**, enabling them to thrive and learn effectively within the curriculum.

Age-Based Placement & Exceptions

- In most cases, students are placed according to their **chronological age** to ensure a balanced learning experience.
- Exceptions to this guideline are rare and are based on the child's readiness, developmental needs, and school assessment.
- Any placement outside the standard age group requires a thorough evaluation and a
 final decision by the Director of Optimist International School in consultation with the
 school counsellor, class teacher, and parents.





School Entry & Cut-Off Dates

In the **Netherlands**, students typically begin their educational journey the **month they turn four years old**, entering **Group 1**. This rolling admission system allows children to start school as soon as they are eligible, rather than waiting for the next academic year.

- The cut-off date for determining the school year a child enters is October 1st.
- Children who turn 4 before October 1st start Group 1 at the beginning of the school year (August or September).
- Children who turn 4 on or after October 1st begin school on their fourth birthday, joining during the academic year.

Upon completion of Group 1, children move to **Group 2** at the start of the **next school year**, provided they turn **five before October 1st**.

- Due to staggered start dates in Group 1, some students spend more time in this group than others, ranging from 10 months (for children born on October 1st) to 1 month (for children born on September 30th the following year).
- This structure ensures all children adjust, learn, and develop at their own pace before transitioning to more structured learning in Group 2.

Personalised Placement Discussions

We engage in **personalised discussions** with parents to ensure the best possible placement for their child.

- Firstly, an online or face to face conversation takes place with the admissions manager.
- The school counsellor or early years admissions lead assesses each child's needs, and the final placement decision is made by the Admissions Manager/Director of Optimist International School.
- Parents are involved in this process, and no placement is finalised without prior consultation.

For students joining groups 2 to 8 mid-year, we insist on an initial classroom visit before starting, this helps them acclimate to the teacher, classmates, and school environment.

'Come and Play' Sessions for Early Years

For our youngest students in **Early Years**), we offer a **'Come and Play'** session before they officially join. This introductory experience supports a **smooth transition into the school environment** and allows the child to feel comfortable before their first day.

Initial Assessment & Adjustment Period

During the first few weeks of school, all students undergo an **initial evaluation** to assess their adaptation and learning progress.

• If adjustments to group placement are needed, recommendations are made in consultation with the class teacher, school counsellor, and Director.





 Any changes in placement are only made after a discussion with parents to ensure alignment with the child's needs.

Class Sizes & Combination Groups

At **Optimist International School**, we aim to maintain **small class sizes**, with a **maximum of 22 students per class**.

- If a class temporarily exceeds this number, **additional teaching support** is provided to ensure quality education.
- We offer both **single-year groups** and **combination classes** (where students from two-year levels learn together), particularly within a **milepost**.

Combination classes provide:

- A **collaborative learning environment** where older and younger students can engage with diverse perspectives.
- Flexible instruction tailored to individual learning needs.
- A continuity of learning within the International Primary Curriculum (IPC) and Dutch Enrichment Programme (DEP).

Placing students, important factors:

When placing students in a class or restructuring a group, we carefully consider a range of factors, including mixed ability levels, social-emotional and learning diversity needs, English language proficiency, and gender balance. At the end of each academic year, our teaching staff and Management Team assess whether a class will remain the same or be reorganized to best support student learning and development.

Due to the **dynamic nature of our international school**, students join and leave throughout the year. In exceptional cases, based on enrolment changes, we may need to **split a group or combine two groups** mid-year to ensure a balanced and supportive learning environment. Our priority is always to create the best possible educational experience for every child.
